The symposium dinner will take place at the Schönbrunner Stöckl, a restaurant located at the edge of the park of Schönbrunn Palace.

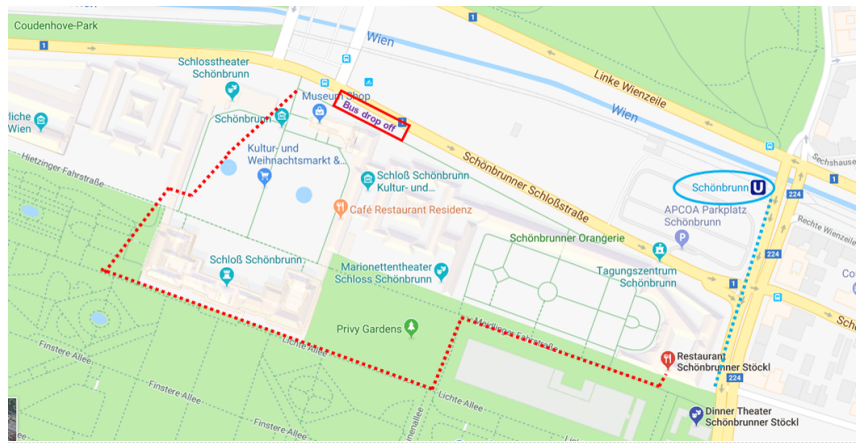

Serving traditional Austrian cuisine, it is equally frequented by tourist and by locals.

Busses will take participants from BOKU to Schloss Schönbrunn. There we will walk through the park to the Schönbrunner Stöckl restaurant, which should take about 10 minutes (red dotted line). At the end of the evening, participants can make their own way back to the city centre using the nearby underground (blue dotted line). Trains heading towards Heiligenstadt will take you to the city centre.
